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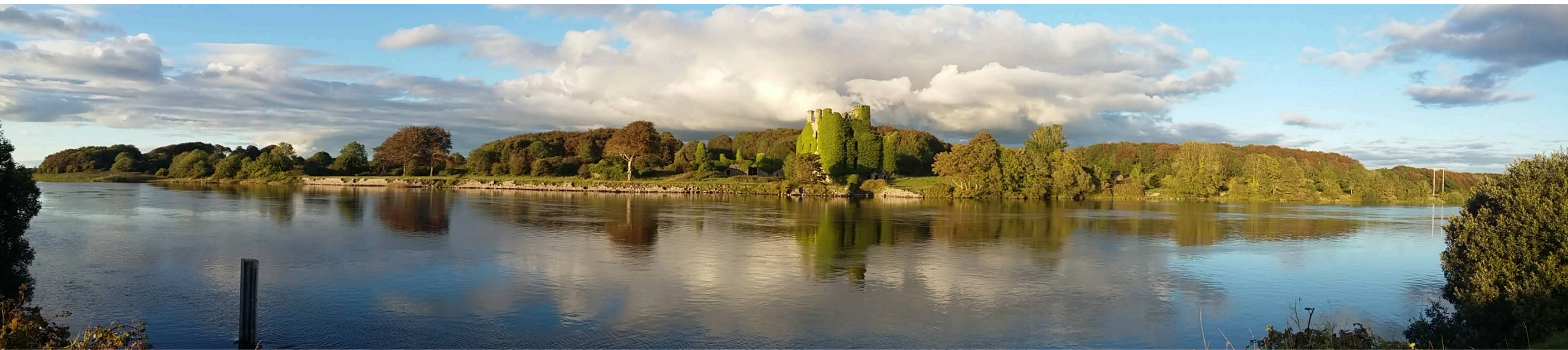

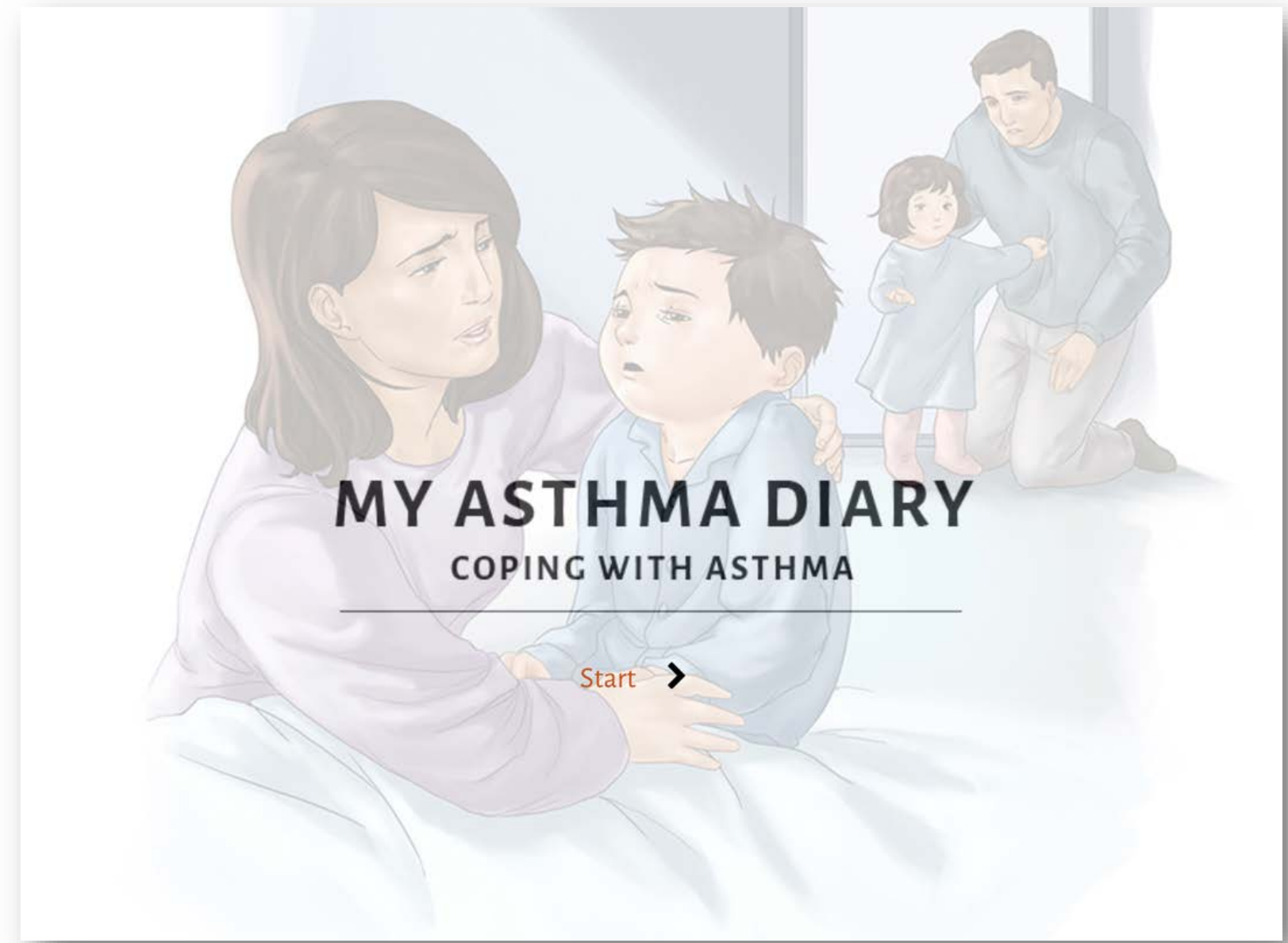

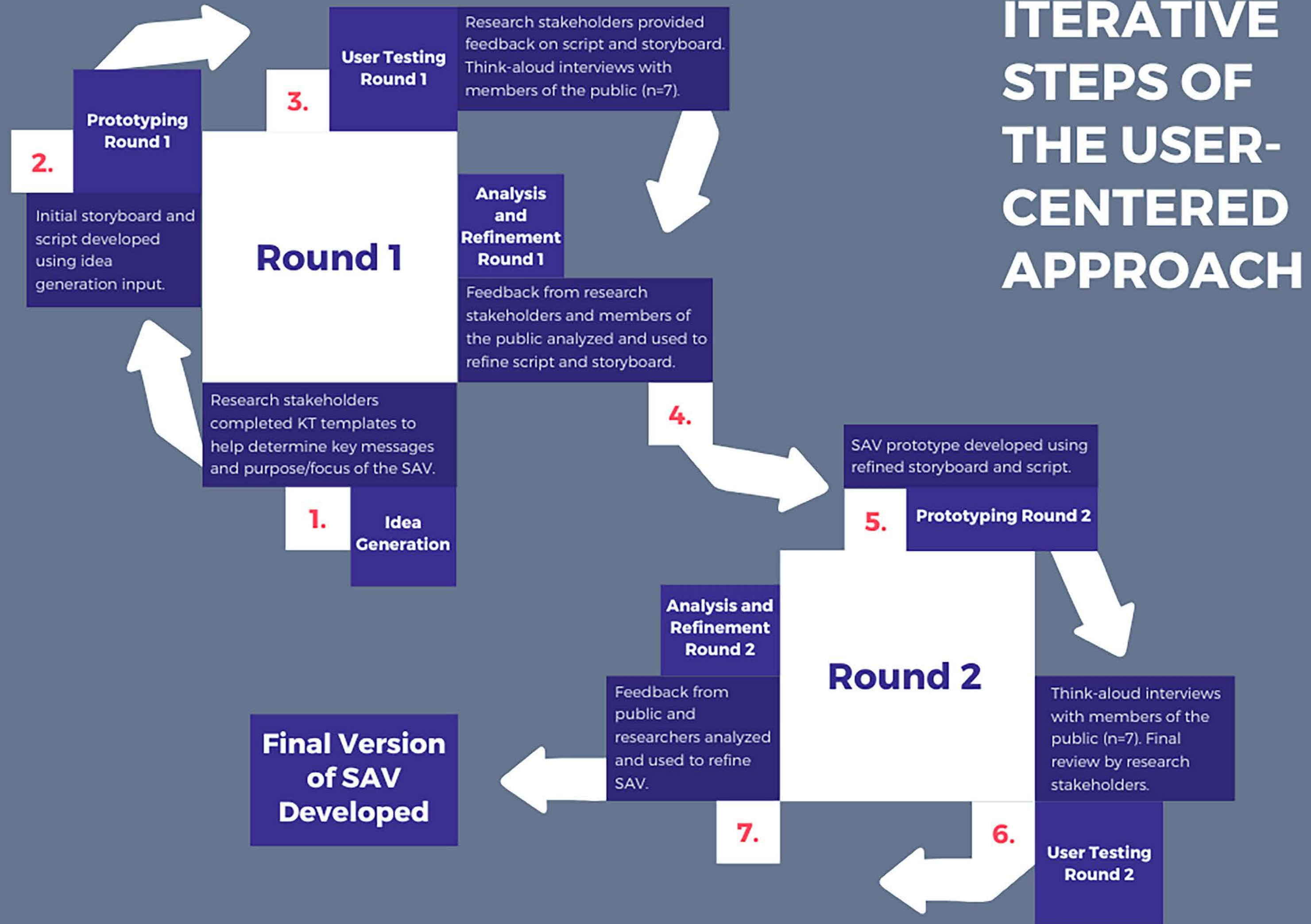
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Our aim:

To develop a video-based knowledge translation resource to explain evidence synthesis to a public audience,
in collaboration with members of the public



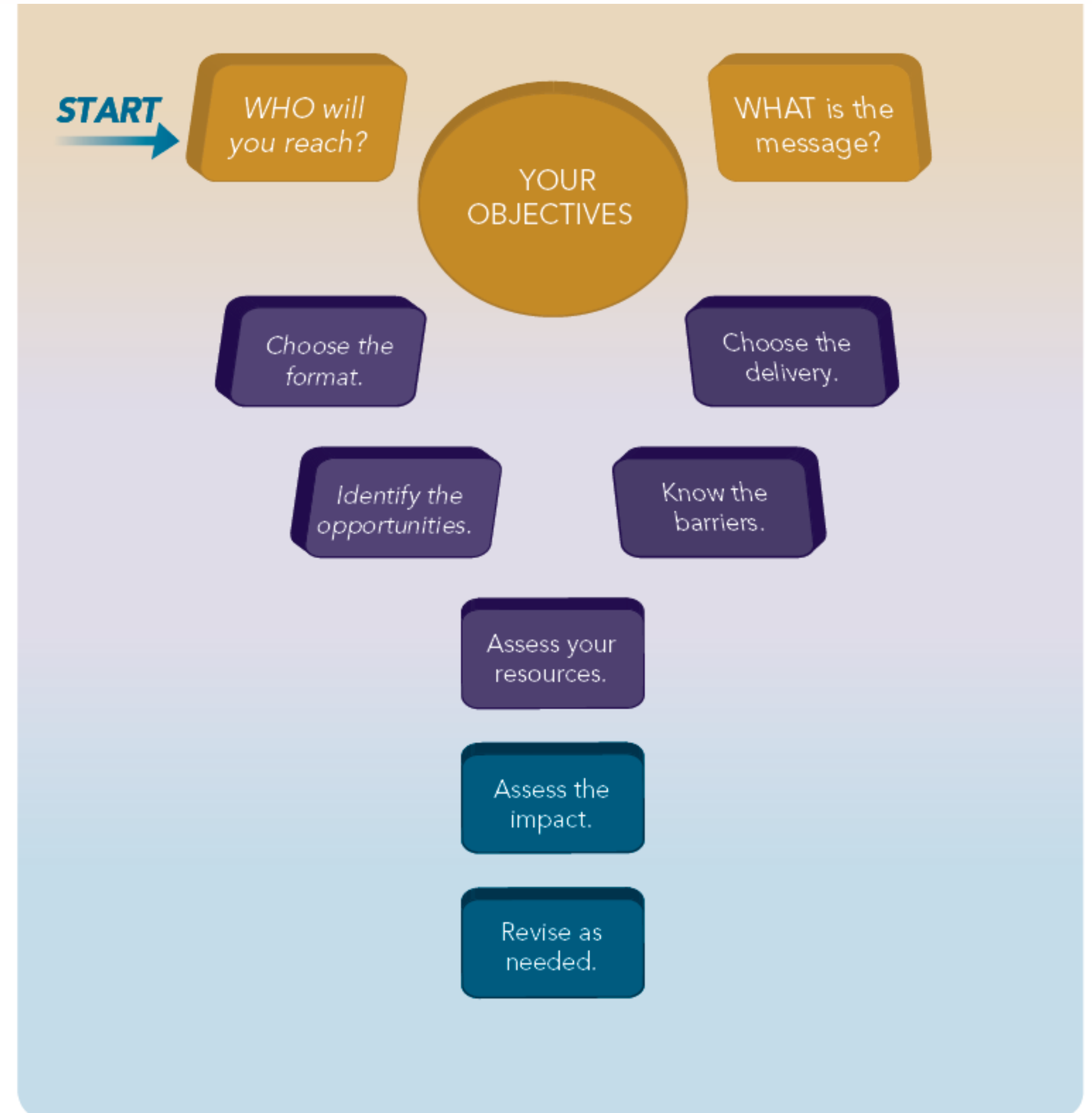
- User-centred design approach (informed by Semakula et al)
- Iterative cycles of 1) Idea generation 2) prototyping 3) user-testing 4) analysis and refinement





Idea generation

- KT Canada KT planning primer template
- 6 researchers with expertise in evidence synthesis, knowledge translation and one experienced Patient and Public Involvement (PPI) advocate





Idea generation - results

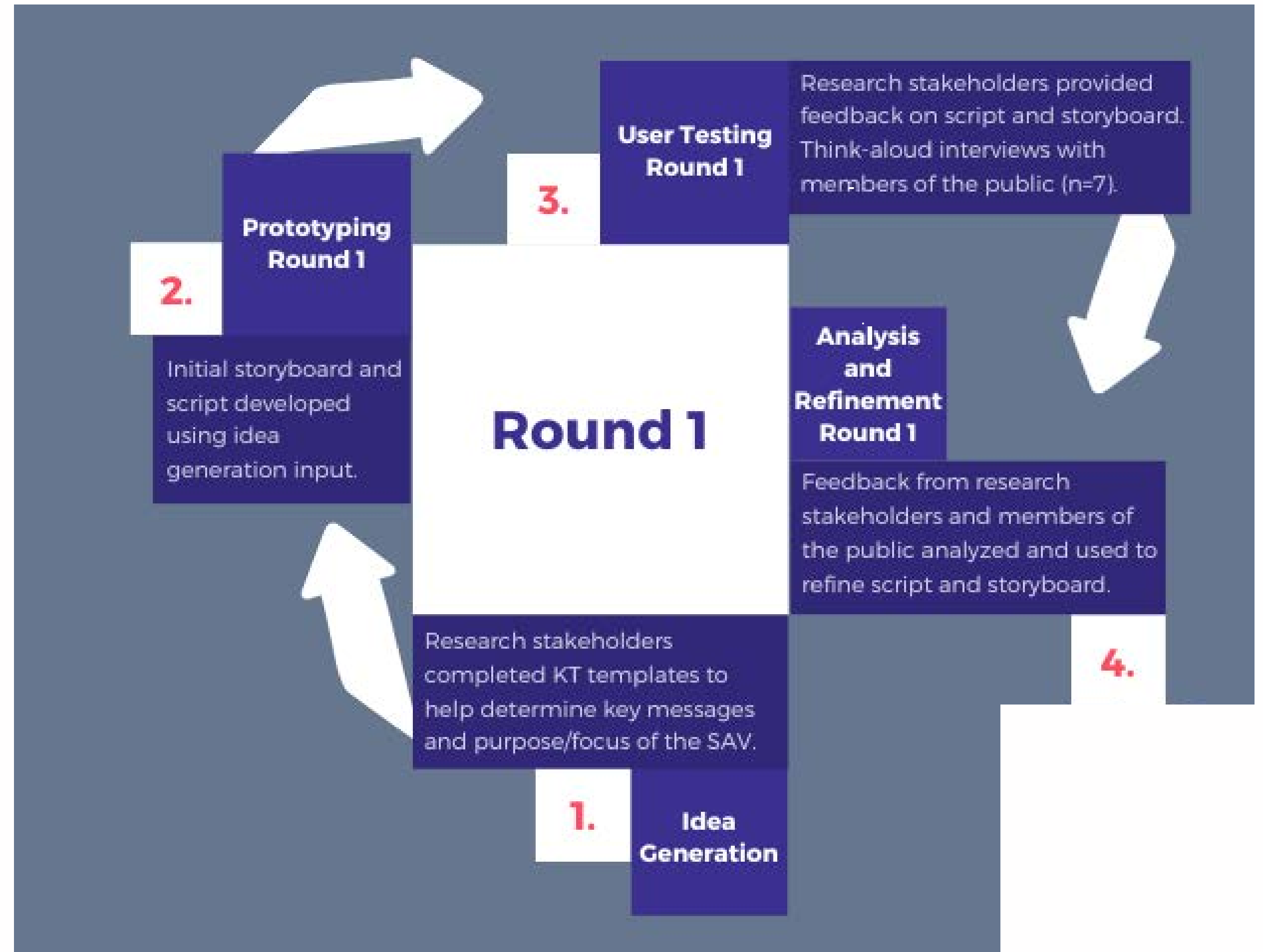
- Identified the key messages for the resource as
 - 1) the importance of evidence synthesis
 - 2) what evidence synthesis is
 - 3) how it can impact decision-making

KT Template Section	Completed Sections
WHO do we want to reach?	Members of the public with little to no research or professional healthcare background
WHY – What are our objectives?	To create a video-based animation resource for our audience, to increase awareness and understanding of what evidence synthesis is (beyond systematic reviews alone) and its importance and role in informing health decision-making amongst the public
HOW – What format will we use?	We will use a video-based Spoken Animation resource. Animation length will likely be ~3 min +/- 1 min (in order to include all determined-to-be necessary key messages).
HOW – How will we develop the resource?	The resource will be co-produced with groups of stakeholders, using a user-centred approach. The first group will comprise researchers with experience of evidence synthesis and knowledge translation to determine the key messages. The second group will comprise members of the public to user test the video development in think-aloud interviews. An adapted version of Morville's Honeycomb Framework for collecting and analysing data will structure the user testing.
HOW – Choose the delivery	YouTube, social media e.g., Twitter
HOW – Assess your resources	One summer student (CD) and two supervisors – evidence synthesis (ET) and technology (EP)



Prototyping – round 1

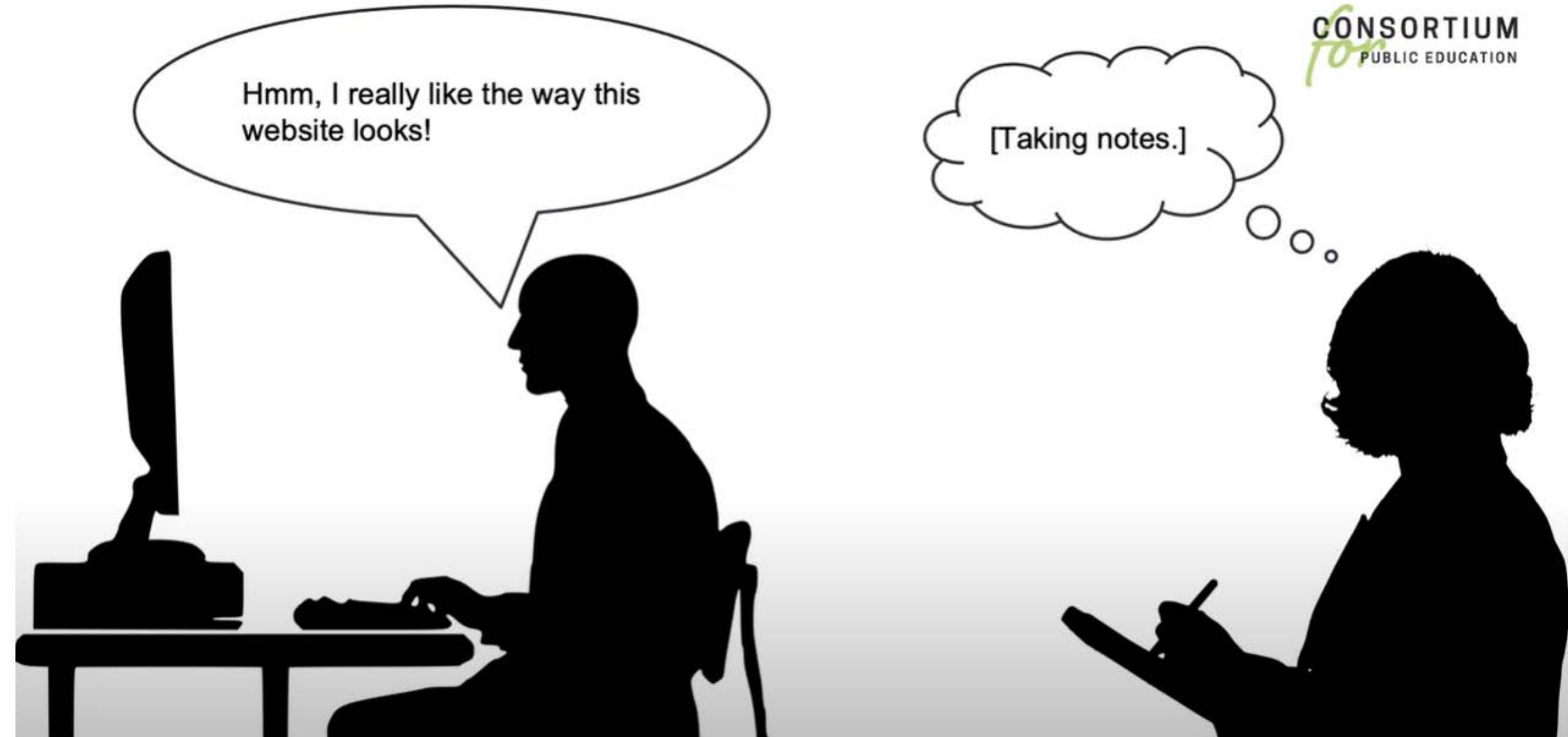
- Initial storyboard and script developed using key messages
- Storyboard - sketches of each scene and verbal descriptions of approximate visuals scene-by-scene
- Animation style samples

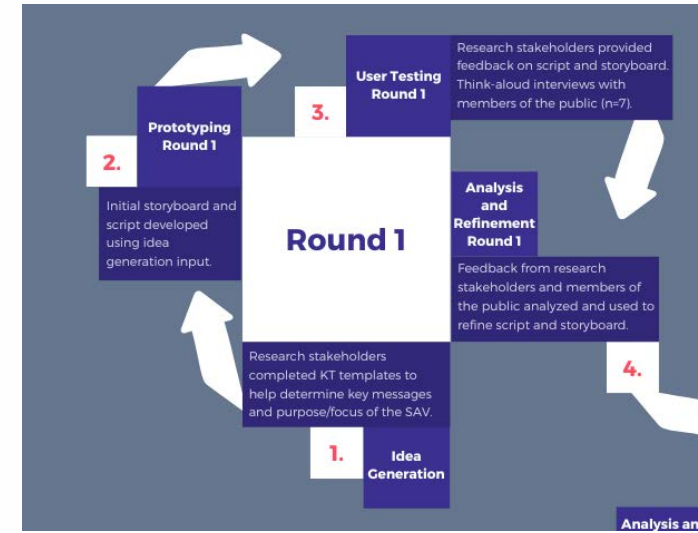




User Testing – round 1

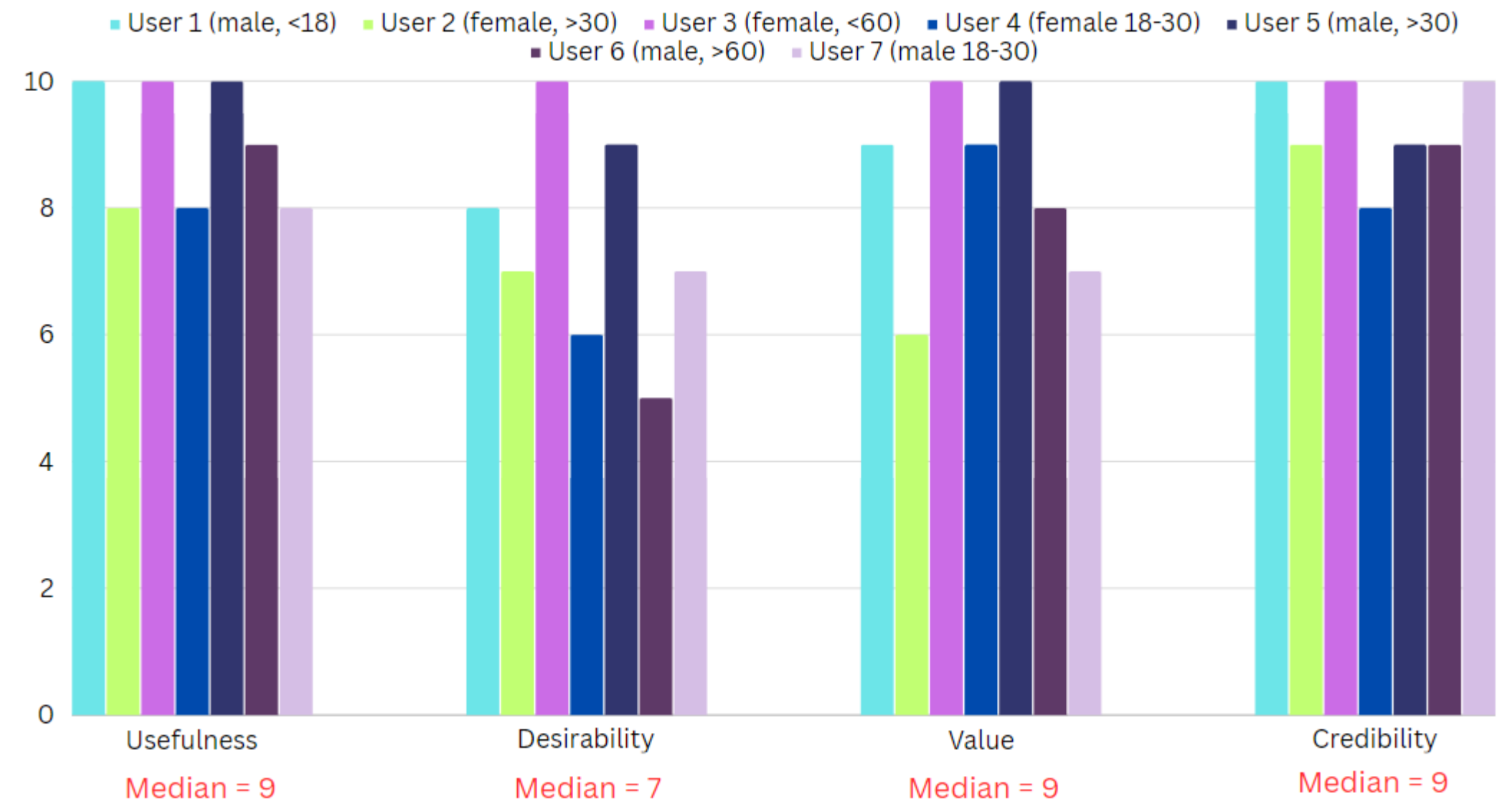
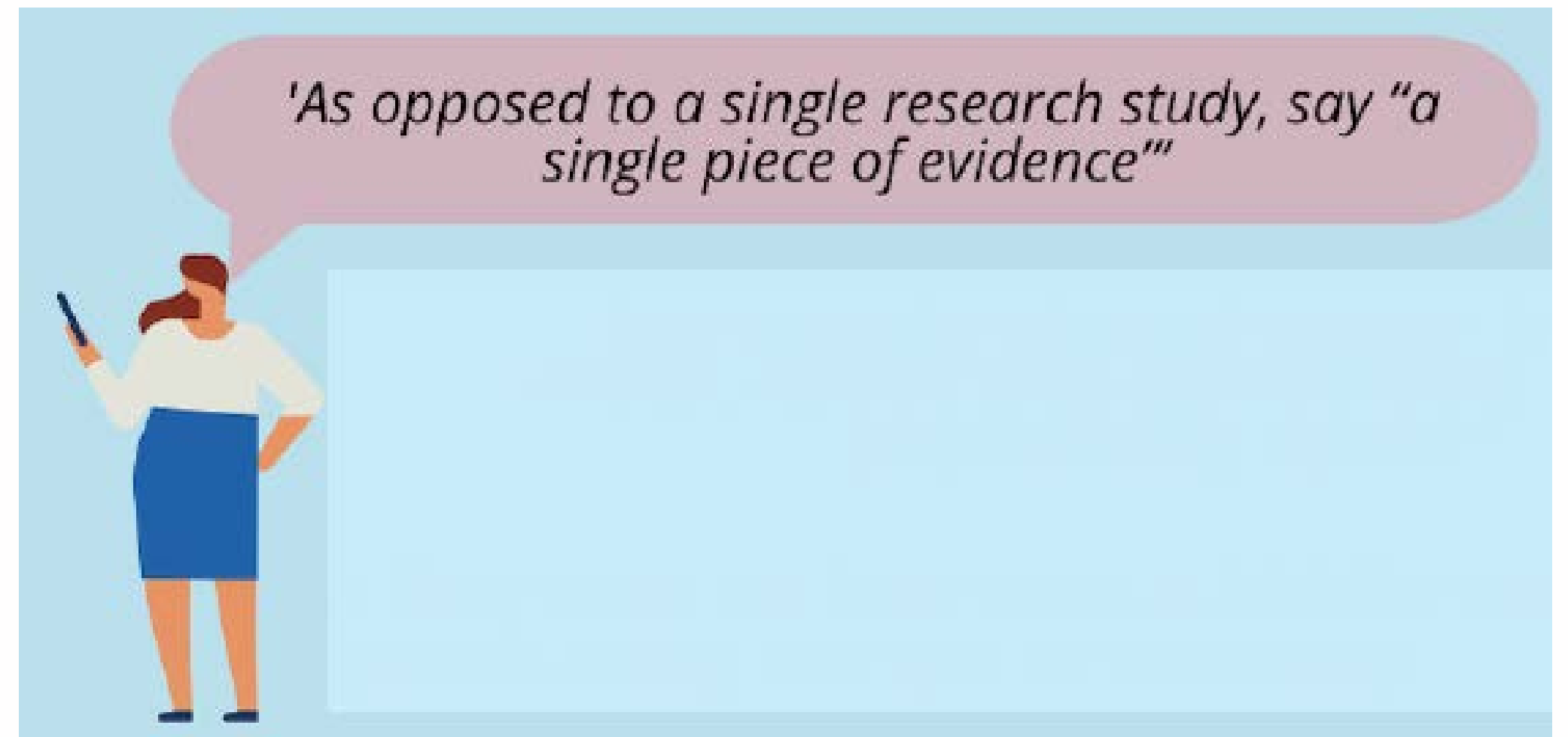
- Convenience and snowball sample
- 7 members of the public
- Think-aloud interviews (lasting 40-60 minutes)
- User experience questionnaires (based on Morville's honeycomb framework)





Analysis and Refinement – round 1

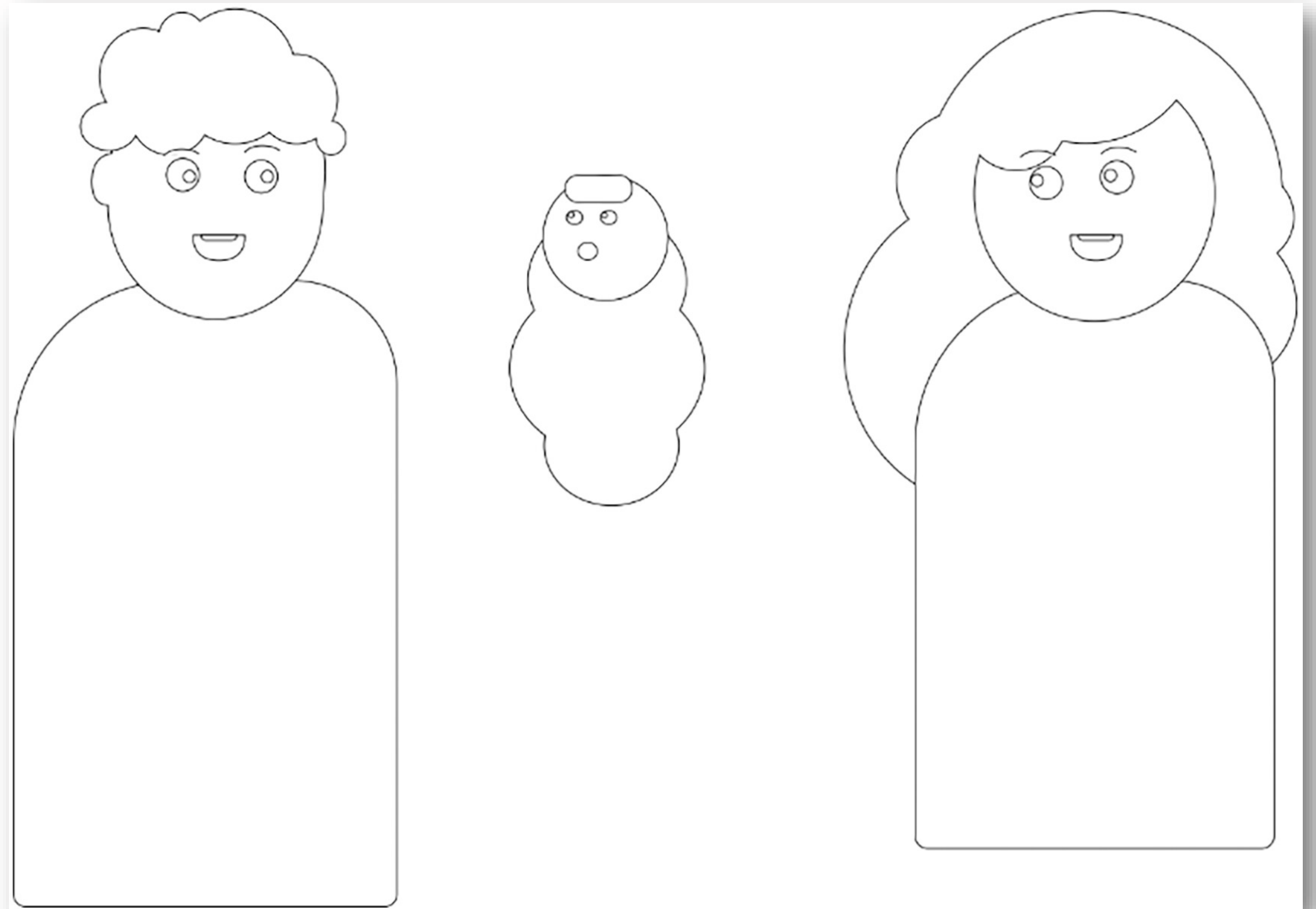
- Thinkaloud data - language use, felt animation style
- User experience ratings
- 3 researchers synthesised findings and edited the script and storyboard accordingly





Prototyping – round 1

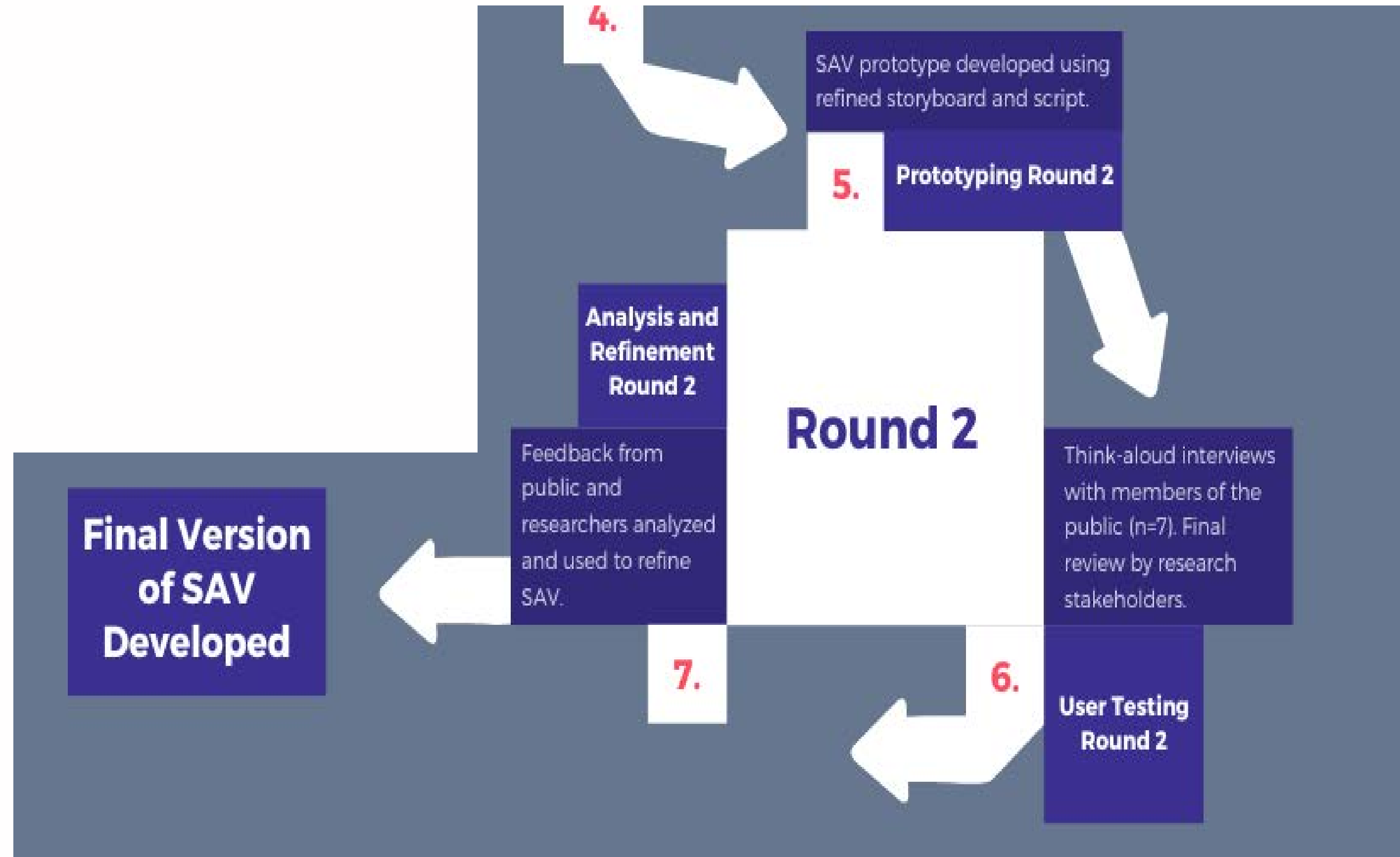
- Basic video animation developed
- Vector animations
- Audio narration added





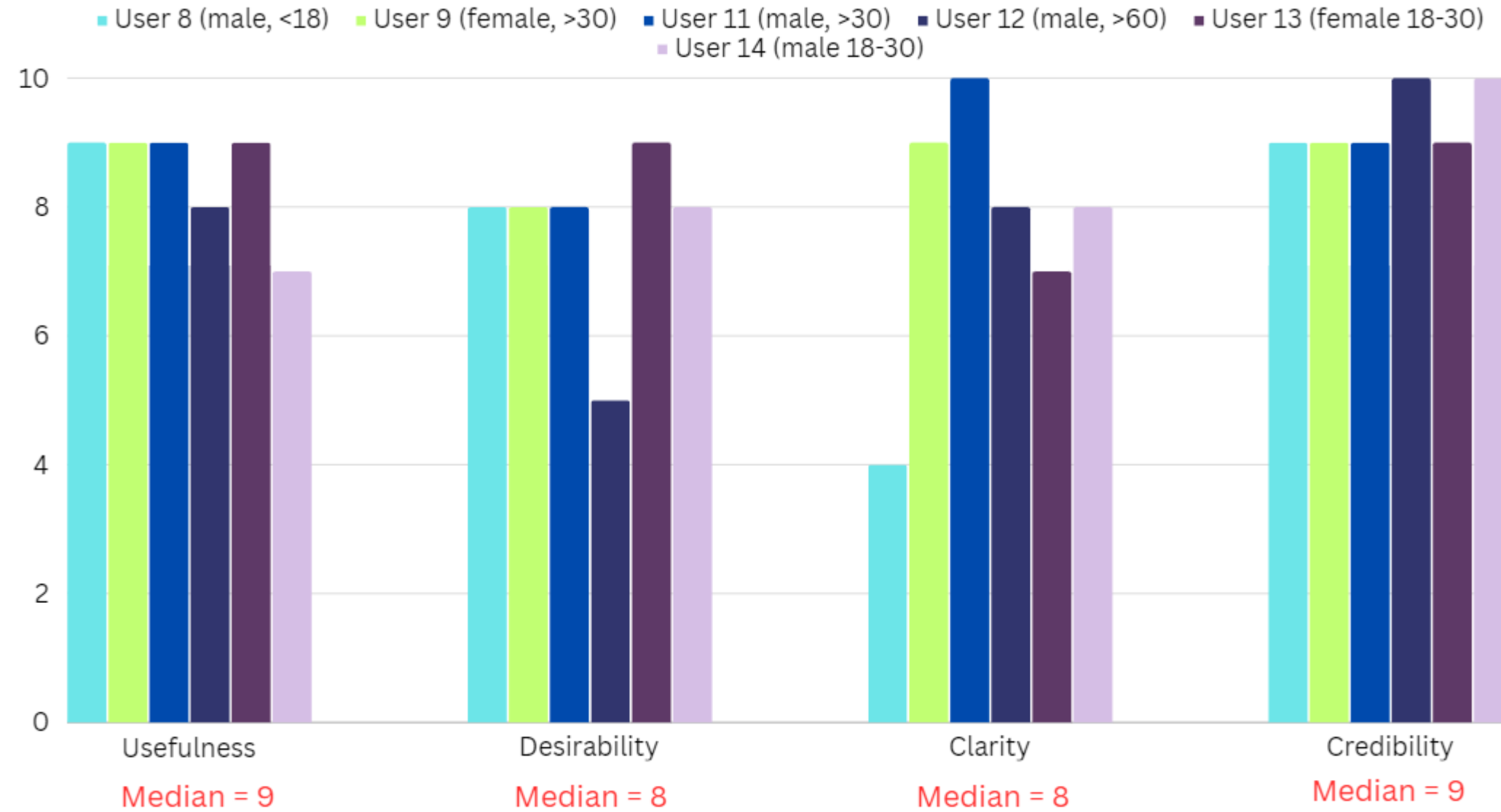
User Testing round 2

- New sample - 7 additional members of the public
- Think-aloud interviews
- User experience questionnaires

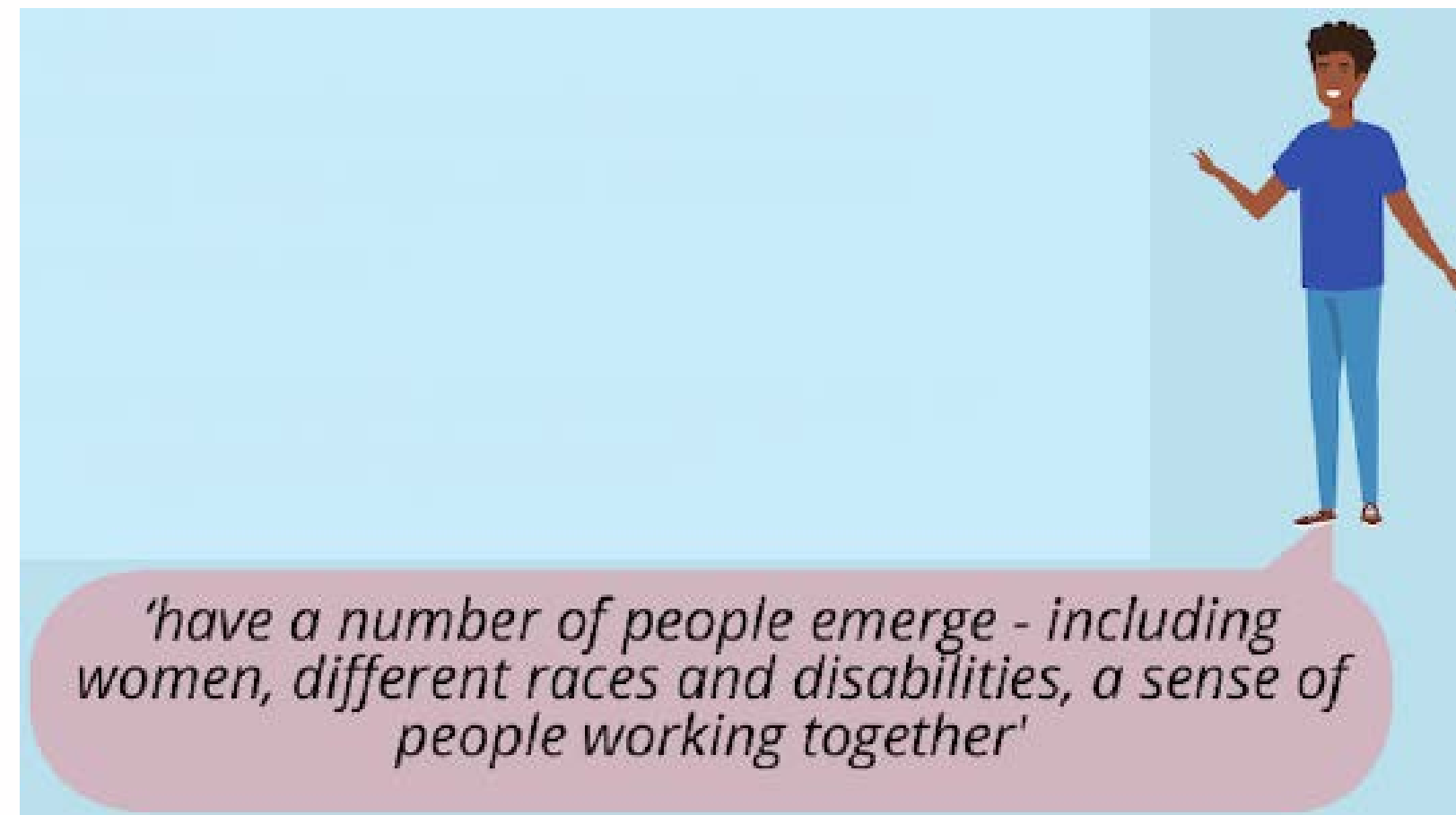


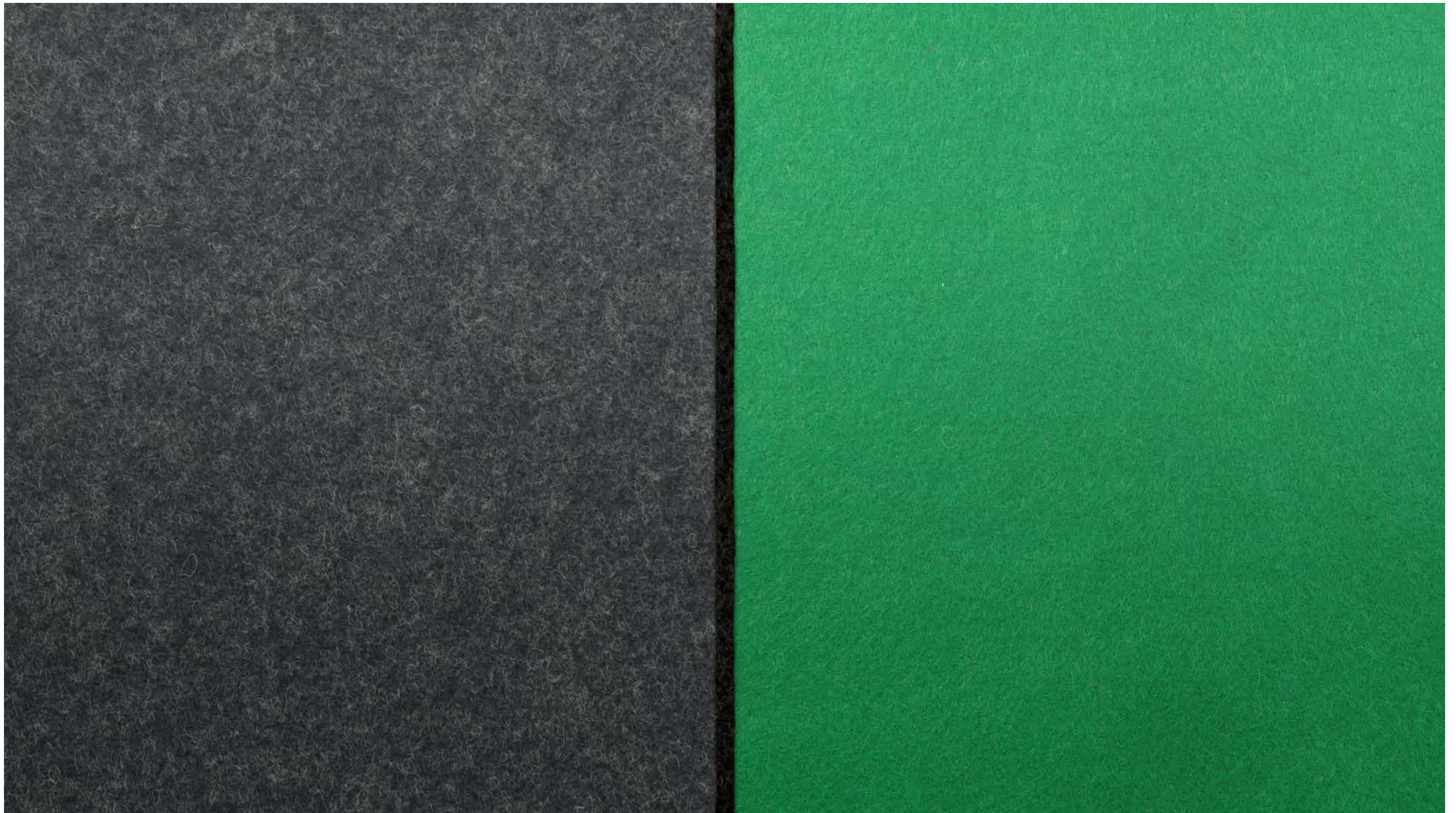


Analysis and Refinement – round 2



- Recommendations to slow speed of visuals and audio, rephrase and language use
- User experience ratings
- Synthesised findings and created sound effects, audio track, stop-motion felt animation applied

Impact on public and patient audience...

- Over 19,000 views, average view duration is > 2 mins
- 10th most viewed video on Cochrane Youtube (out of 506 videos)
- Translated into German and Spanish, exploring Norwegian
- Used in Patient and Public Involvement training globally, e.g. COVID-End, SPOR Evidence Alliance



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Impact on KT literature...


- Example of how to systematically develop an impactful KT resource to explain a complex topic with limited resources – 8 weeks, €2000 ESI Summer Studentship
- Detailed example of how to involve public contributors through user-centred design methods
- Process helped enhance its credibility, clarity and usefulness

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Final reflections...

- Credible source and substantial networks of Cochrane, Cochrane Ireland
- KT Planning Primer and User-Centred Design methods very useful
- Building in research questions within KT projects – impactful KT public resource and academic output
- Working with public audiences requires substantial time and planning
- More money, time and hindsight?
 - Public involvement earlier (planning primer)
 - More systematic approach for analysis and refinement phases, e.g. content analysis, NVIVO
 - How could enhance video view duration – more cycles?
 - Evaluate the effectiveness of the resource, exploring for other methodological topics
- Acknowledge Evidence Synthesis Ireland Summer Studentship funding

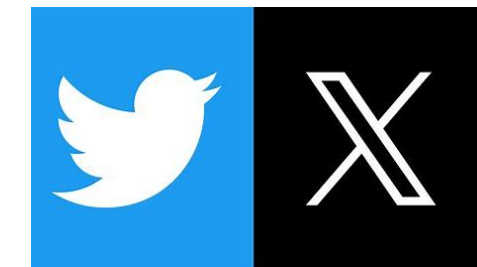
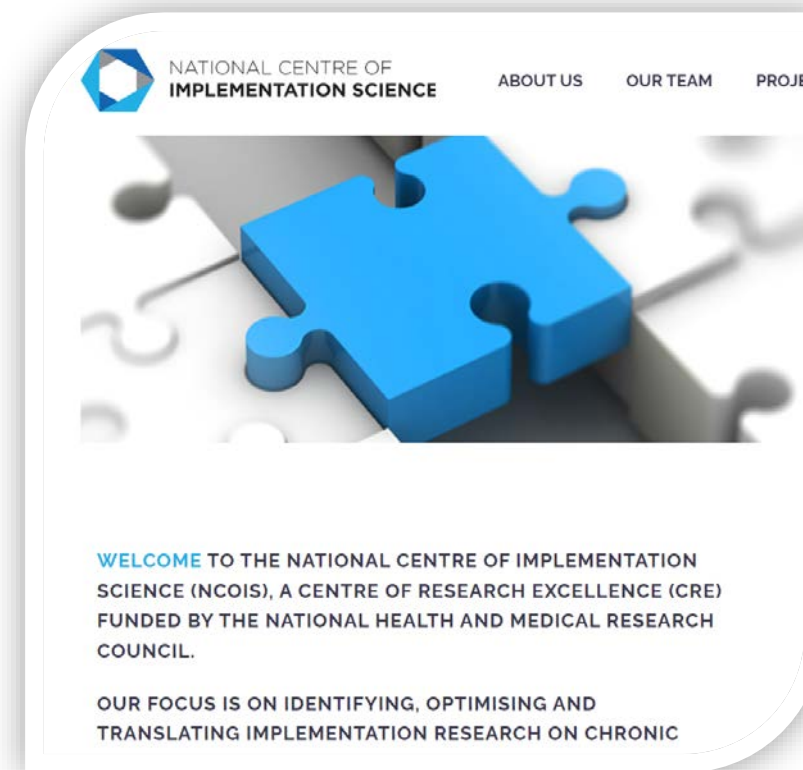
